

TUXEDO TENNIS CLUB INFORMATION AND RULES

1. **TUXEDO TENNIS CLUB, Inc (TTC)** is a non-profit organization governed by an annually elected Board of Directors.
2. **TTC** is a member club and pays dues to Tennis Manitoba and, by association, is a member of Tennis Canada.
3. Members of **TTC** must sign a waiver, pay membership fees, abide by Court Booking Rules and Limitations (see point 8 below), print out their membership card (which is sent by email upon completion of online registration) and carry their membership card with them at all times when they are on the courts. Members may be asked to show their membership card by staff or members of the Board of Directors.
4. **Guests:** Non-members pay a \$15 guest fee for the day. All guests must **complete TTC's online guest registration form and waiver prior to playing and check-in with staff upon arrival**. If no staff is present, then guest use of the facility must be in the accompaniment of a club member and the fee must be deposited in the black locked mailbox found beside the front door. Guest usage of the club is limited to 3 occasions per season.
5. Members and guests must not visit the club if they are sick or are positive for Covid or if they are experiencing new onset or worsening of any of the following symptoms: fever (>38' or subjective fever/chills), cough, sore throat/hoarse voice, shortness of breath/breathing difficulties, loss of taste or smell, vomiting or diarrhea for more than 24 hours.
6. Proper tennis attire must be worn at all times while on the courts. This means non-marking tennis shoes and shirts on when playing. Members should change into court shoes on arrival at the clubhouse to protect the court surfaces.
7. **Entrance to the club:** If the clubhouse is staffed, players enter through the clubhouse. If the clubhouse is not staffed, players must enter through the side gate using the entry code. Access to clubhouse washrooms is via the patio door facing the courts using the code provided for the keypad entry. Gate code and patio door code are provided on the Members Only Page of the club website once the club has opened for the season.
8. **Courts and the ball machine*** must be booked using the court booking system at: <https://holdmycourt.com/reserve2/tuxedotennis>. For instructions on how to register for this site and use it, go to the club web site at tuxedotennis.com and click on "Court and Ball Machine Booking Help and Instructions" on the Membership/Members Only webpage. Click [here](#) for **Court Booking Rules and Limitations**.
*Note: orientation to the ball machine and payment of an hourly fee are requirements to use it.
9. There is no smoking allowed on the **TTC** grounds, including within 10 meters of the clubhouse door to the parking lot.
10. Any liquor consumed on the premises must be purchased from the club as required by Manitoba Liquor, Gaming and Cannabis Authority for facilities with a liquor license.
11. When entering or in the court area, be considerate of others:
 - a) Use the appropriate gate to enter, so as not to walk behind other courts.
 - b) Wait until play has stopped before proceeding to your assigned court.
 - c) Do not retrieve your balls from behind another court until play stops on the other court. You may ask the players on the other court to retrieve them once their play has stopped.
12. On occasion, leagues and tournaments will have precedence over casual play.
13. Members should take pride in helping keep the grounds and clubhouse neat and tidy.
14. **All members must be aware of the information and rules as well as the TTC code of conduct**, tuxedotennis.comCode-of-Conduct . Members are encouraged to remind other members of the rules in a non-threatening way, but ultimate enforcement of the rules is up to the staff and Board of Directors. If there are constant violations, please send your concerns in writing to the Board where they will be addressed. The Board can be emailed at tuxedotennisboard@gmail.com.
